The suggestions regarding the basic facilities of college classroom teaching, examination system, attendance etc. invited from the students' parents' are as follows:-

A. Basic Facilities

- (i) Sufficient arrangements be made for regular electric supply and watercoolers.
- (ii) Special attention be paid to the cleanliness of the college campus and more trees and plants be planted to make environment pollution free.
- (iii) Sufficient facilities be provided for sports and games.

B. To reform examination system

- (i) Semester system be introduced at UG and PG level.
- (ii) Marks secured in Internal Assessment to be added in the result of main examination.

C. Classroom Teaching

- (i) Extra classes be arranged for weak students also.
- (ii) Importance be given to e-classes and computer classes.

D. Students' Attendance

- (i) Biometric attendance be mandatory for students also.
- (ii) Parents be informed about the short attendance of their children.

E. Curricular and co-curricular activities

- (i) Activities regarding placement and employment be increased
- (ii) Sports and games activities be encouraged
