From the next session 2014-15, it had been compulsory for every government college to adopt this process. The College has been successfully done the work and feels very good with this new admission process. The DCE inviting every year suggestions for betterment and improvement in the online admission process and it will be extended for all the courses and classes in near future. 5. Evidence of Success: Evidences of the success of this practice are: • Increased number of application for fresh admission because of a student can apply sitting anywhere and not need to come to college for purchasing application forms as well as submit it. . Messages directly sent to the selected candidates. • Information directly sent to the candidates for checking of documents, deposition of fees, allotment of subjects etc. • The process made more transparent, one can see easily online anywhere the status of admission.
