STUDENT FEEDBACK REPORT
SESSION 2021-22

For the academic year 2021–22, the internal quality assurance cell of Shri Govind Guru Govt. College, Banswara, performed an online and offline feedback survey. In order to gather input about the college's performance, the specified format was distributed to normal students, parents, teachers, and alumni. For the creation of the current report, the 261 regular students' responses were collated.

- Profile of respondents: 47.12% of the total responders are from the arts faculty, 29.28% are from the science faculty, 29.28% are from the agriculture faculty, and 06.89% are from the commerce faculty. 52 respondents out of a total of 261 respondents (19.92%) are from postgraduate classes; 45% of these students are pursuing their M. Sc., 52% are enrolled in the Masters programmes in various disciplines offered by the Arts faculty, and 3% are pursuing their M. Com. A total of 80.07% of the responders are undergraduate students from various faculties.
- In the 261 replies that were provided in response to the question about syllabus understanding, 64% of the respondents felt that the syllabus' level of comprehension was average, 15% found it tough, just 7% found it very difficult, and 14% found the syllabus to be very simple.
- 71% of the overall respondents are satisfied with the teaching aids that the teachers utilize in their classes, whereas 29% disagree with how they should be used. In terms of co-ed activities, 74% of respondents believe that the college administration pays enough attention to managing the continuity of co-ed activities throughout the entire session, while 26% still believe that there needs to be a better balance between educational and co-ed activities throughout the entire session.
- When evaluating basic amenities, we considered a number of factors, including classrooms, laboratory supplies, libraries, clean drinking water, access to clean restrooms, ambient energy supply, and overall infrastructure.
- A. The availability of clean drinking water: 74% of respondents agree with this statement, while 6% express dissatisfaction (disagreement) with this facility. While only 3% of students

strongly disagree with the availability of safe drinking water on college campuses, 17% of students strongly support this.

a. The provision of clean restrooms is acknowledged by 69% of respondents, whereas 10% of respondents express dissatisfaction (disagreement) with this amenity. While only 7% of students strongly disagree with the availability of clean restrooms on college campuses, 14% of students strongly agree with this.

b. Laboratory resources: 68% of respondents are happy with the lab resources offered by the college, whereas 6% are not happy (disagree) with the resources. While 0% of students are very dissatisfied with this, 24% of students are very satisfied with the laboratories that are provided on college campuses.

c. 7% of the students are dissatisfied with the library facilities, however 21% of respondents ranked the library in the college as "outstanding," 32% as "very good," and 40% as "good."

•For any educational institution, moral and ethical principles are just as crucial as curriculum. These values are also given more emphasis in our new educational policy. Another important factor for a healthy and effective teaching learning process is the overall teaching and learning atmosphere. When we surveyed student about it, we got a range of responses:

a. Offering moral and ethical value-enhancing activities to students: 58% of respondents agreed that the college should offer such activities throughout the entire session. 13% of the respondents are dissatisfied, however. While 10% of students feel that there is not enough availability of these kinds of activities, 19% of students are very satisfied with this issue.

b. Overall environment for the teaching-learning process: 77% of respondents are happy with the college's overall teaching-learning environment, whereas 7% of respondents are not happy (disagree) with the atmosphere there. While only 3% of students strongly disagree, 13% of students strongly agree with this issue.

over all the response is satisfactory but in some areas still some scarcity can be seen as by the obtained review. Some areas like overall environment of the college, teaching learning process, student centered activites, basic facilities are good but few issues could be seen which demands more efforts like number of faculty, library facility, curriculum design, infrastructure especially smart classes and studios. One massive gap was observed regarding communication, extension and implementation any innovative initiative is less techno friendly student and remote localities.

TEACHING FACULTY FEEDBACK REPORT

2021-22

The internal Quality Assurance Cell of SGG Govt. college, Banswara collected the feedback from the teaching faculty of the institution for the session 2021-22. A questionnaire comprising of 19 questions was framed for the purpose. The responses and opinions received are as under:

1 following main attributes were taken for the survey:

- a Syllabus
- b. Books
- c Administration
- d. Infrastructure of the institute
- e Evaluation scheme and design
- f. Freedom regarding adopting innovative strategies for teaching and learning

➤ In terms of the syllabus, we considered a number of factors, including the goals and objectives' applicability, relevance to the course, size, and balance between theory and application. The majority of faculty members (61%) expressed dissatisfaction with the syllabus's applicability and updating. Faculty members provided the following advice/suggestions regarding the curriculum:

1. The syllabus should be created to meet the demands of the modern age.
2. The practical paper's syllabus in the scientific stream has to be reviewed.
3. The content's level of difficulty needs to be reframed to fit the proficiency of the local students.
4. The curriculum for M. Sc. classes should be in line with the CSIR NET exam.

➤ Infrastructure facility: The majority of faculty members choose the average (54%) response, indicating that infrastructure facility deserves more consideration. 17% of the faculty members are dissatisfied with the college's infrastructure as it stands. More focus is required to build IT-based resources, particularly in light of the most recent pandemic years. Every professor is exhorted to create a smart recording studio.

- The relationship between administration and teachers is rated favourably by 59% of faculty members, while only 18% believe that there is still a communication gap between administration and faculty. 11% of respondents expressed a high level of satisfaction with the administration.
- Library resources: The majority of faculty members (66%) are dissatisfied with the infrastructure and resources provided by libraries. The majority of the library's books are out of date. 17% of the professors are pleased with the library's resources.

ALUMNAE FEEDBACK REPORT
2021-22

SGG Govt. College, Banswara's Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) solicited input from SGG Alumnae Association members in order to evaluate the college's advancements throughout 2020-21. The 15-question survey was created to get a sense of how the alumni felt about their alma mater, their relationship, and their experiences as students.


- It was encouraging to learn that everyone who responded expressed pride in their affiliation with SGG College. Old alumnae still feel a sense of pride in the college, which suggests that the college's reputation is still intact. In their comments, they have cherished important events from their college experience (answer to question no.15). All of the respondents agree that their college degree taught them valuable principles that are still applicable in the modern world. They also believe that their college education has instilled moral ideals in them.
- The college provides an environment conducive for learning, research and intellectual development This is evident from the positive responses from the 90% respondent who are satisfied with the overall activities organized by college.
- 86% of graduates believe that professors are helpful in providing academic support. According to 61% of respondents, the curriculum is ineffective in helping students develop a variety of job-related abilities.

For the benefit of their alma institution, all respondents said they would like to make contributions in kind and money. In addition to providing financial support, they are willing to give up their valuable time to mentor students and offer their services as needed by the institution. However, there are some areas that require attention, such as the academic initiative made by the college to close the gap between industry and academia. The feedback report is being submitted to the college administration as necessary information

and further action.



PARENTS FEEDBACK REPORT: SESSION 2021-2022

For the academic year 2021–2022, the college's IQAC unit conducted a survey and gathered information from parents of enrolled regular students. To gather information, a questionnaire with 15 questions was created. the following is the response:

1. The majority of parents (74%) concur that teaching and learning take place in colleges, with only 6% strongly disagreeing. Only 12% of respondents are certain on this matter.
2. While 34% of respondents believe that there is still a need for infrastructure development in many areas, especially smart classes, clean toilets, drinking water resources, garden and nursery, and canteen, 59% of parents are satisfied with the infrastructure and facilities currently available in the college.
3. It is a source of pride that the majority of parents (92%) concur that this college offers a higher calibre of education than any other college in the city.
4. Has the curriculum been created in such a way that it fosters in students a variety of job-oriented skills in addition to technical competencies? Parents' reactions are shown to be inconsistent. The majority of parents (56%) are in disagreement, which suggests that the curriculum needs to be created to meet employment requirements.
5. Whether the parents' complaints and issues were promptly resolved? We received accurate numbers from the parents. The management of the college is rated favourably by parents in about 71% of cases.
