

## **Anandam**

In view of the Covid 19 pandemic scenario the mandatory '*Anandam*' course will be run online. Anandam course carries 2credits/50 marks per semester (one project) or 100 marks for annual scheme (two projects). Both the ppts and formats for synopsis and final project report should be shared with all faculty members of the college as all will be mentors for the class allotted to them. The power point presentation of guidelines of *Anandam*, formats of synopsis of project and final project report must be displayed on website of Colleges/Departments/Universites/Institutes.

The following guidelines will facilitate the Mentors for online activities:

### **I. For daily individual activity of *Anandam***

The mentors are to be appointed for each class and be asked to make **Whatsapp** groups with the students. The mentor will discuss in detail about *Anandam* with students in the groups.

They will:

- Instruct every student to maintain a daily register wherein he/she shall make a daily entry date wise of the act of goodness done by him/her. It is essential to maintain this register of daily activity to qualify for the award of certificate of appreciation.

### **II. Group Projects**

2 credits/50 marks per semester (one project) or 100 marks for annual scheme (two projects).

- Divide the students in WhatsApp groups of 8-12 students in proportion to number of students in the Class.
- The students will select a project and report to the mentor. They will be asked to prepare a synopsis of the project.
- Share the list of projects that can be taken up by the students. You can also invite suggestions from student groups for resolving local issues for their projects
- Instruct students to take photographs and to take certificate from GO/NGO if collaborating with their activities
- Instruct them how to prepare the synopsis and final report of the project as these will be evaluated for marks and awards.

### **III. Online *Anandam* day**

Online *Anandam* day is to be celebrated in the last week of every month in which student groups will make presentation about the activities they are engaged in. You can also share motivational lectures /videos /movies /organize webinars on this day

Mentors have to submit a monthly report of group activities along with photographs, collaboration with GO/NGO and media coverage (if any) to the Nodal officer of the College who will compile the information of the group activities only and share it on the Google spreadsheet with nodal officer *Anandam* at Commissionerate level
