They also make effective presentations and give and receive clear instructions. They understand the importance of critical thinking, social interaction, effective citizenship, ethics and environment and sustainability. Ultimately, they acquire the ability to engage in independent and life-long learning.

### **Program Specific Outcomes:**

The stakeholders understand the nature and basic concepts of ecology. They analyze the relationship between human beings and nature. Based on these outcomes, the stakeholders learn goal-setting, problem solving techniques and decision making. The institution evaluates the stakeholders as Class Toppers, University Rank Holders and Best Outgoing Students. They are recognized and awarded during the Annual Day function by giving them Certificates and Mementos. Gold Medals are awarded to the University First Rank holders and Silver Medals to the remaining rank holders. The Best Outgoing Students are evaluated on the basis of five criteria: Academic Performance, Attendance, and Behavior inside the class room, Behavior on the campus and Extracurricular activities. The program outcomes and program specific outcomes are measured by conducting Monthly Tests and Annual Examination. The attainment of students is also measured by keeping surprise test and asking spontaneous questions during the lecture.
