History

Since its inception in 2008 Government Girls College, Sadulshahar, district Sriganganagar is an educational institution in North Rajasthan which is committed to working in the field of Higher Education to empower the girl child. As the main aim of the institute is to contribute to the welfare of the society through the upliftment of women who are nurturers of the society, the goal is to develop the girl child through education and has remained our best hope as we move ahead in the Twenty- First century.

The college is located in Sadulshahar which is a small town which is named after Maharaja Sardul Singh, son of Maharaja Ganga Singh, who established it. A large village named "Matili" was transformed into Sadulshahar. It is a peaceful town in SriGanganagar which was once a part of the Bikaner state before independence. It is an agriculture based industry centre in Rajasthan. This town is situated on the border of Punjab and Rajasthan.

The College was established in 2008 with with less than 25 students in the Arts stream as undergraduate status. In the last academic session 2022-23 the total number of students were 753. Furthermore, it was upgraded to post graduate level in 2016 with the opening of Masters programme in Home Science. In the year 2022 the college was further upgraded by introduction of science at under graduate level. Now it is well known multi-faculty institution of Sadulshahar of Sriganganagar district. At present, the college is offering three programmes at UG level namely Bachelor of Arts (B. A.), Bachelor of Science with PCM (B.Sc. Non-med) and Bachelor of Science with BCZ (B.Sc. Med) and running four programmes at PG level namely MA in Home Science, History, Political Science and Punjabi. The college offers B.A. programme in eight elective subjects namely English Literature, Hindi Literature, Punjabi Literature, Political Science, Economics, Sociology, Home Science, and History with 38 combinations.
