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1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 INTRODUCTION

Government Girls College in Sadulshahar, Sriganganagar district, Northern Rajasthan, is dedicated to advancing higher education for girls. Established in 2008, it has evolved into a versatile institution, offering undergraduate and postgraduate programs. Located in Sadulshahar, named after Maharaja Sardul Singh, it sits on the border of Punjab and Rajasthan, once part of the Bikaner State. With less than 25 students initially, it now boasts 753 students. The college provides undergraduate programs in Bachelor of Arts (BA), and Bachelor of Science (BSc) imparting students with a diverse range of academic options and postgraduate programme like Masters of Arts (MA) in Home Science, History, Political Science, and Punjabi. The college's emblem, featuring Maa Saraswati, symbolizes the pursuit of knowledge and liberation, as captured in its Sanskrit motto, "?????????????????????" (**Sa VidyaYaVimuktaye**), that is "Education Liberates." To translate this picture into words, it could be said that, the education gained shall ultimately lead to liberation of the individual from the shackles of ignorance, inability, incompetence, and shall make him all-powerful to compete and survive in any kind of adverse situation.

Curricular Aspects

Government Girls College, Sadulshahar, affiliated with Maharaja Ganga Singh University, Bikaner, implements a structured curriculum designed by the university, ensuring effective teaching through a documented process. The introduction of the semester system at the University from session 2023-24 marks a significant shift in its academic structure, enhancing learning outcomes and providing students with a more dynamic educational experience. This change facilitates a structured approach to curriculum delivery, fostering deeper engagement, and allowing for more comprehensive assessments of student progress. Thereby reflecting the university's commitment to academic excellence and innovation in higher education. The college offers undergraduate programs in Arts and Science and postgraduate program in arts adopting an Elective Course System with subject combinations displayed online. Faculty members, serving as members of the Board of Studies, actively contribute to curriculum design and revision, considering current social issues. Besides this, faculty members take part in the evaluation process of the affiliating university. Timetable committees ensure efficient scheduling, aided by various ICT tools used in teaching. An academic calendar, aligned with guidelines from the Commissionerate of College Education, facilitates the planning of curricular and extracurricular activities. The institution innovatively addresses teacher vacancies through technology and partnerships with other Colleges. This collaboration offers live online classes, pre-recorded lectures, PDF notes, doubt-clearing sessions, and practical demonstrations, enhancing students' skills. The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) plays a pivotal role in maintaining educational quality through interactions with stakeholders, supported by a robust feedback system. Overall, the college prioritizes curriculum effectiveness, student choice, technological integration, and quality assurance to provide a holistic educational experience.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

The institution utilizes a Centralized Online Admission Process (OAP) for undergraduate and postgraduate programs, adhering to the admission policy set by the Commissionerate of College Education, Government of Rajasthan. This process, transparently executed, provides comprehensive information via the college website. Admissions follow the State Government's reservation policy to ensure social justice for students. The faculty comprises Ph.D. and M.Phil. qualified educators meeting NET/SLET recruitment criteria. Curricula emphasize theoretical grounding alongside practical application, fostering analytical and problem-solving skills. Active student engagement is encouraged, with teachers employing ICT tools for varied learning styles.

Students access teaching and counselling support informally via mobile communication and formally through designated channels. The college offers student support services, including library facilities, common student areas, and well-equipped laboratory. Various committees oversee extracurricular activities, guest lectures, and skill development initiatives, fostering holistic student development. The Placement and Counselling Cell emphasizes both employment and self-employment opportunities.

Affiliated with Maharaja Ganga Singh University, the college serves as a significant examination center for regular and non-collegiate students. Adequate support is provided throughout the examination process, including form submission and post-result issues. Course and Program Outcomes are displayed on the college website, with continuous evaluation and corrective measures. Over the past five years, the pass percentage has consistently exceeded 95%, with notable achievements such as Miss Komal Munjal receiving the Gold Medal for academic excellence in the MA Home Science Examination 2020.

Research, Innovations and Extension

The college's Research and Development Committee, in collaboration with the IQAC, fosters research activities by encouraging faculty participation in conferences, seminars, workshops, and short-term FDPs. In the previous academic session, over 80% of faculty attended a short-term FDP on "Implementation of NEP-2020" organized by IGNOU. Faculty engagement includes attendance at international and national conferences/seminars and pursuit of Ph.D. degrees in line with UGC rules, with three faculty members currently enrolled. The Placement and Counseling Cell collaborates with various organizations to promote self-employment, offering training workshops and skill development activities.

The college utilizes social media platforms for sharing study materials and fostering blended collaborative learning. Community-oriented initiatives, facilitated by NSS, Rangers, and Eco Club Units, include plantation drives, cleanliness programs, blood donation, and sanitary pad distribution in adopted hamlets. The institute celebrates various commemorative days and organizes diverse activities through different cells, promoting holistic development. Notable achievements include Ranger girls participating in national events like the 18th National Jamboree in Rajasthan Pali District.

Despite limited sports facilities, college students excel in martial arts through training provided by a local sports academy, formalized via an MoU, boasting a remarkable sports legacy across disciplines such as Quan ki do, Karate, Wosho, Punching slide, and Boxing. To address teaching vacancies, the college collaborates with other colleges to share resources and academic initiatives. Technology, including online classes, pre-recorded lectures, and virtual demonstrations, helps enhance students' skills.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

The institution boasts infrastructure across a 22,555 sq.m area, including a well-equipped main building housing administrative offices, ventilated classrooms, a library, ICT Room, and Home Science laboratory. The college's ICT room serves multiple functions, including hosting online classes, educational and motivational presentations, and showcasing programs as directed by the Directorate of College Education and also facilitates IQAC-related work. Thus it supports the college's commitment to modern education delivery, academic excellence, and quality assurance initiatives. Using an existing room as a makeshift science lab is a practical

short-term solution to address the immediate need for laboratory facilities. The college is undertaking a development project to expand its infrastructure. Detailed blueprints for new science and postgraduate blocks have been prepared and submitted to relevant authorities, including the Commissioner Department of College Education, JD Planning, and the local MLA. This initiative signifies a significant step forward in improving campus facilities to benefit students and the community.

The institution further prioritizes the integration of IT into administrative, financial, admission, and examination processes, ensuring efficient operations and support for students and staff alike. The library offers Wi-Fi access and subscribes to newspapers and magazines, with plans to join N-LIST for expanded scholarly resources. The campus is under 24/7 CCTV surveillance and features a battery-operated inverter to combat power cuts. It maintains a pollution-free, green environment with indigenous flora and fauna and sufficient amenities for Divyang individuals, including ramps and wheelchairs. The college grounds include a large playground for various events, enhancing community engagement.

Student Support and Progression

The college's Research and Development Committee, in collaboration with the IQAC, fosters research activities by encouraging faculty participation in conferences, seminars, workshops, and short-term FDPs. In the previous academic session, over 80% of faculty attended a short-term FDP on "Implementation of NEP-2020" organized by IGNOU. Key portals include IFMS 3.0 for financial management, SIPF for insurance, and Rajkaj App for administrative tasks. Additionally, RGHS ensures healthcare access, while e-Dak facilitates swift communication. These initiatives streamline processes, especially in salary, budget, and pension management. Moreover, educational initiatives like the DCE portal for admissions and scholarships underscore the state's commitment to transparency and accessibility. Faculty development programs and financial management are priorities, with funding from various sources including student fees, donations, and government allocations. The college serves as a nodal institution for newly established government and private colleges, responsible for inspection and compliance. An integrated quality assurance framework, led by the IQAC, ensures continuous improvement through review meetings and feedback mechanisms involving students and stakeholders, disseminated through the college website.

The institution prioritizes empowering girls from rural, backward, and border-belt areas through quality education led by experienced faculty members. The college achieves high pass percentages, with notable achievements like Miss Komal Munjal receiving a Gold Medal in M.A. Home Science. Girls of the institution are supported by scholarships and initiatives like the distribution of free sanitary napkins under the 'I M Shakti Udaan Scheme'. Ranger girls excel in training camps and national events, while students shine in sports, martial arts, and cultural competitions, contributing to the college's reputation in the Bikaner Division. The Career and Guidance Cell enhances employability skills, leading to success stories like Rekha's employment at Nehru Yuva Kendra and her impactful community development work. The College epitomizes environmental consciousness through its commitment to sustainability. Embracing the 3R approach - reduce, reuse, recycle - the college promotes eco-conscious practices in waste management and resource conservation. The college boasts a vibrant sporting tradition across a spectrum of disciplines including Quan ki do, Karate, Wushu, Punching slide, and Boxing. Students consistently demonstrate outstanding prowess in inter-collegiate, inter-university, and global competitions, garnering acclaim across the board. Among the notable achievements is Ms. Pooja's remarkable success, securing both gold and bronze medals at the esteemed 2019 International Goju Ryu Karate Championship. Institutional preparedness for NEP

1. Multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary:	Government Girls College, Sadulshahar, affiliated with Maharaja Ganga Singh University (MGSU), Bikaner, is committed to fostering interdisciplinary approaches to education in alignment with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. The university has revised its curriculum and implemented the same from session 2023-24 to meet NEP-2020 standards. The college offers undergraduate programs in Bachelor of Arts (BA) and Bachelor of Science (BSc), providing students with a diverse range of academic options. The institution emphasizes holistic development by integrating various disciplines and perspectives, evident in the 38 combinations available for BA students. Similarly, BSc students benefit from foundational subjects like Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Physics and Maths. Core subjects like Hindi, English, Elementary Computer Application, and Environmental Studies are taught in the first year, enhancing students' interdisciplinary understanding. Collaborative teaching in Botany, Zoology, and Chemistry further promotes interdisciplinary learning. Initiatives like the Science Club and "MEIN BHI VIGYANIK HUN" program bridge the gap between humanities and science, cultivating basic scientific knowledge among all students. Through these interdisciplinary approaches, the college strives to nurture well-rounded individuals equipped to tackle diverse challenges in their chosen fields.
2. Academic bank of credits (ABC):	Our college is affiliated with MGSU Bikaner. The university has introduced the Academic Bank of Credits from the 2023-24 academic session after conducting numerous seminars, discussions, workshops, and write-shops on implementing the Choice-based Credit System (CBCS) and Learning Outcome-based Curriculum Framework (LOCF) under the NEP 2020. Further the university is standardizing the curriculum structure to facilitate the transfer of academic credits to the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC), as outlined in the NEP-20
3. Skill development:	Skill development initiatives focus on enhancing students' self-esteem, leadership abilities, and problem-solving skills. Collaborations with organizations like RSETI and Nehru Yuva Kendra aim to offer short-term courses in stitching, food preservation, and computer training. Students also

The Placement and Counseling Cell conducts workshops on email communication and internet safety, benefiting a significant number of students. Competitions and events promoting human values, Indian culture, and patriotism are regular features, contributing to students' holistic growth.</p>

Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course):</p>	<p>The institution's commitment to integrating Indian knowledge systems is evident through bilingual teaching and the introduction of the M.A. Punjabi Program. Cultural competitions and festivals celebrate India's rich heritage, fostering a sense of national pride. Focus on outcome-based education (OBE) ensures alignment with the university's learning objectives, while adaptation to distance and online education during the pandemic underscores the institution's resilience and adaptability. Faculty training programs on NEP-2020 implementation ensure effective integration of policy objectives into college practices, with over 80% of staff completing relevant training recognized by UGC-HRDC.</p>
<p>5. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):</p>	<p>The institution's curriculum design and delivery prioritize holistic student development and competence. Both graduate and postgraduate programs prepare learners for opportunities in central and state government services. The focus of program outcomes (POs) and course outcomes (COs) is to impart essential knowledge and skills critical for students' competence and personality development. Although there isn't a specific mechanism for measuring outcomes, monitoring and evaluation occur through monthly tests, quizzes, group discussions, participation in co-curricular activities, and employability assessments. The reflection of POs and COs is evident in university examination results, accessible through the university's examination portal. Faculty members analyze student performance for various purposes and engage in discussions about outcomes in Academic Council and Board of Studies meetings. The college boasts a high pass percentage, with numerous students pursuing higher education and achieving notable accolades, such as Miss Komal Munjal's Gold Medal in the M.A. Home Science Examination 2020.</p>

The institution addresses teacher vacancies in science and economics through technology and partnerships with other colleges, offering live online classes, pre-recorded lectures, doubt-clearing sessions, and practical demonstrations. The institution boasts ample infrastructure for academic and extracurricular activities, utilizing its main building efficiently for various purposes. Spanning 22,555 sq.m, with a built-up area of 1680 sq.m, the campus features essential facilities. These include administrative offices, well-equipped 5 classrooms and a one new classroom under construction a home science laboratory with modern amenities, an ICT room with Wi-Fi connectivity, and a student union office. The college's ICT room serves multiple functions, including hosting online classes, educational and motivational presentations, and showcasing programs as directed by the Directorate of College Education and also facilitates IQAC-related work. Thus it supports the college's commitment to modern education delivery, academic excellence, and quality assurance initiatives. Using an existing room as a makeshift science lab is a practical short-term solution to address the immediate need for laboratory facilities.

Additionally, the campus is 24x7 monitored by 23 CCTV surveillance, backup power through a 60 KW inverter, and plans for solar panel installation to combat power cuts.

Amenities for students include a canteen serving snacks and beverages, 12 toilets, water coolers with RO-filtered water, and accessibility features for Divyang individuals. The campus is adorned with lush green lawns, diverse flora, and fauna, providing a serene environment conducive to learning. Furthermore, the college grounds serve as venues for significant district events and national celebrations, reflecting its integral role within the community.

The college has embarked on an ambitious development initiative, with plans in motion to expand its infrastructure. Detailed blueprints for the construction of new science and postgraduate blocks have been meticulously prepared and submitted to key stakeholders including the Commissioner Department of College Education, JD Planning, and our local MLA for review and endorsement. The initiation of this process marks a significant stride towards enhancing our campus facilities to better serve our students and the community.

Recognizing the importance of expanding access to scholarly resources, the college is actively working towards subscribing to the National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content (N-LIST). Once implemented, this subscription will grant the college community access to an extensive repository comprising over 6,000 journals and more than 1,64,300 eBooks. This initiative underscores the college's dedication to providing comprehensive educational resources to both faculty and students.

The College library is well maintained and it has comfortable furniture and proper light arrangement. Two books are issued to a student against an ID card. As per the guidelines and orders of Commissionerate, Department of College Education, Rajasthan, a community book bank was established in 2019. Donated books are classified under Book Bank. The library also has Wi-Fi facility with an open access to students.

The library also subscribes to a diverse range of newspapers including The Times of India, Employment News, Rajasthan Patrika, Seema Sandesh, and Dainik Savera, providing current affairs updates and job opportunities to the college community. Specialized magazines like Grihshobha cater specifically to Home Science courses offered at the college, while Antarrashtriya Chronology serves broader academic interests.

Government-endorsed platforms like Rajasthan Single Sign On (SSO) streamline these operations. Biometric attendance tracking for employees, though temporarily suspended due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

IT in finance and accounts

All financial tasks are accomplished on Paymanager and PFMS portal. SIPF app under SSO portal is meant for provident fund and State Insurance services provided by Government of Rajasthan.

IT in student admissions and support

The process of admission is completely online. Admission related information such as admission policy, important dates, admission lists are made available on the web page of the college. Admission related work such as verification of forms, generation of admission lists, promotion of students, result update etc. are done through DCEAPP under SSO portal. Students can apply for various scholarship schemes through the SSO portal of National Scholar Portal. Their forms are verified on this portal and a student does not have to submit a hard copy of the scholarship form.

Faculty Welfare Measures

Employees are mandated to contribute to the General Provident Fund (GPF) and State Insurance (SI) for future benefits, with the provision of Group Insurance Scheme (GIS) against accidental reasons. Welfare measures adhere to guidelines issued by the Commissionerate, Department College Education, Government of Rajasthan, Jaipur.

Benefits include access to the Rajasthan Government Health Services (RGHS) for medical expenses, gratuity, encashment of earned leave, and pension provisions for superannuated employees.

Leave Provisions

Female employees benefit from Child Care Leave (CCL) for 730 days, while maternity leave of 180 days is available twice during the service period. Various other leaves such as Casual Leave (CL), Earned/Privilege Leave (PL), Half Pay Leave (HPL), Commuted Leave, Parental Leave, and Child Care Leave for single male parents are also provided. Additionally, teaching staff can avail of 15 days of Special Casual Leave for academic activities.

Compassionate Appointment

In the unfortunate event of an employee's death during service, compassionate appointment provisions are available to dependent family members.

Other Benefits

Children of serving and retired government college employees receive a 3% bonus during admission to government colleges.

Performance Appraisal System

The institution follows the Performance Appraisal System (PAS) mandated by the Commissionerate, Department of College Education (DCE), Rajasthan, Jaipur. The introduction of an online PAS streamlines the process, with employees required to fill their performance appraisal reports online through the Raj Kaj portal. Appraisals cover aspects like conduct, work culture, behavior, health status, and overall contribution to institutional responsibilities.

Physical inspections of departmental stocks and commodities are conducted at the end of each session to ensure proper asset management.

Accounts Sectio

Financial accounts are meticulously maintained by the Accounts Section, headed by the Assistant Accounts Officer (AAO). This section oversees the details of financial transactions and ensures compliance with GF&AR.

Procurement Committee

The institution forms a 'Nivida evam Kray Samiti' committee at the session's onset, responsible for all institute purchases. Procurement tasks adhere to GF&AR guidelines to maintain financial integrity.

Financial Audits

MahavidyalayaVikas Samiti undergoes annual audits conducted by a chartered accountant.
