Action Taken Report

Progress and Implementation Status

Infrastructure Development

1. Library:

 A proposal for establishing a fully equipped library, including digital facilities, has been prepared. The allocation of funds under the PM USHA scheme will prioritize this development.

2. Classrooms and Furniture:

 Plans to construct additional classrooms and procure adequate furniture are underway. Funds have been requested and will be allocated as per PM USHA guidelines.

3. Sports Facilities:

 The construction of a sports ground and running track, along with the maintenance of existing facilities, has been included in the developmental plan. Implementation will proceed after budget approval.

4. Basic Amenities:

 Measures to improve water and sanitation facilities, as well as ensure regular cleanliness, are being actively pursued.

Academic Improvements

- Faculty Shortage: The recruitment of permanent faculty across all subjects remains a key focus. Requests for additional faculty positions have been forwarded to the appropriate authorities.
- 2. Introduction of New Programs: Proposals to introduce B.Sc. (Science) and postgraduate courses have been submitted to appropriate authority.
- 3. Integration of Technology: Smart classrooms have been proposed, with funding allocation in process for the procurement of necessary equipment.

Extracurricular Activities

1. Educational Tours and Field Trips:

o Plans to organize regular educational tours and field trips have been initiated.

Administrative Suggestions

1. Student Union Elections:

The reinstatement of student council elections is not within the purview of the college administration. This matter is subject to decision by the **State** Government.

2. Motivational Programs:

 Periodic motivational programs and student-teacher interaction events are being planned to foster a positive academic environment.

Significant progress has been reported across several areas, with a majority of the recommendations being addressed through proper planning and fund allocation under the PM USHA scheme.
