For Science PG students course-work and practical were conducted with CBCS scheme of examination as directed by UGC.

Currently 39 students are persuing the programe of their Ph.D at the college under the supervision of faculty members. Students have also submitted the projects for research grant. The DST FIST grants were provided to the chemistry department. Rajeev Gandhi fellowship for research has been granted to four students at our college.

Computers, kiosks, internet, reprographic and other facilities have been made available in the Library. The college is using NME broadband and 4 mbps lease line connection of internet.
