The meeting ended with a vote of thanks presented by the student nominee.

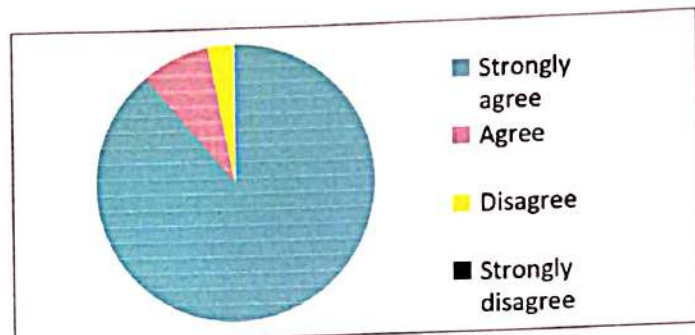

The Report of Student's Feedback (Session-2022-23)

The student's feedback committee headed by Sanju Balot and other members of the faculty were assigned the task to collect the feedback from the students and prepare a report to be submitted before the Hon. Director IQAC for further action. The committee performed the assigned task within the given time period and used the following methodology to prepare the report.

The method:

The student's feedback collecting committee decided in its meeting to collect the concerning data from 100 students only as per the sample survey method adopted in recent times by various agencies, the students were selected through random sampling method. It was assured that the students who are taking part in this feedback collecting process should belong to all the three facilities viz. humanities, commerce and science hailing from both U.G. and P.G. courses.

The analysis:

- (i) The students who found the admission procedure easy and convenient, the results according to the percentage count are as under:
89% (strongly agree), 8% (agreed), while only 3% (disagreed) and 0% (strongly disagreed)
- (ii) Students found that the campus is well maintained and hygiene regulated in toilets, the results according to the percentage count are as under:
29%(strongly agree) ,45%(agreed), 23%(disagreed) and 3%(strongly disagreed)
- (iii) While replying to the query regarding teaching and innovations, the results according to the percentage count are as under:
82% students (strongly agreed), 15% (agreed), 3% (disagreed) while no one strongly disagreed to it.
- (iv) Students found that the appropriate attention is paid towards co-curricular and sports activities, the results according to the percentage count are as under:
92% (strongly agreed), 7% (agreed), 1% (disagreed), while no one strongly disagreed
- (v) While replying to the query regarding the college campus is free from ragging and other forms of physical abuses or biases, the results according to the percentage count are as under:
98% (strongly agreed), 2% (agreed) while no one is disagreed and strongly disagreed



The outcome:

- The outcome suggests that the institute's admission procedure is easy and convenient and the committee recommends no change.
- The committee suggests that the cleanliness and hygiene standards are not up to the mark and immediate attention should be given to address this issue.
- The committee suggests that the students are satisfied with the quality of teaching and implementation of innovative practices in the institution.
- The committee suggests that co-curricular and sports activities in college make the students highly satisfied and contended.
- The committee as per the feedback obtained found that the college campus is free from ragging and other forms of abuses etc., which could be considered as a remarkable achievement.

Parent's Feedback: Report (Session: 2022-23)

As per the given instructions the feedback collection committee headed by Ms. Sanju Balot (convener) decided to collect the feedback from the parents of the enrolled students through offline method. The committee decided to limit the number of respondents to 100, so as to get an easy and convenient analysis of the obtained data.

The method:

The feedback collection committee selected 100 students through random sampling method; each student was handed over a form which was to be filled by his or her parent to be deposited before the committee within 6 days.

The analysis:

- (i) The parents who found the admission and office procedure easy and convenient, the result of which according to the actual no. and percentage count is as under –
92% (strongly agree), 7% (agree), 1 % (disagree) and 0% (strongly disagree).
- (ii) The parents who found the campus is well-maintained; the classrooms are kept clean and greenery is abundant, the result of which according to the actual no. and percentage count is as under –
27% (strongly agree), 63% (agree), 8 % (disagree) and 2 % (strongly disagree).
- (iii) The parents who found the quality of the available infrastructure is good (library, smart rooms, labs, ICT facilities), the result of which according to the actual no. and percentage count is as under –
81% (strongly agree), 13% (agree), 6 % (disagree) and 0 % (strongly disagree).
- (iv) The parents who found the quality of teaching/learning is good and attention is paid towards campus placement, the result of which according to the actual no. and percentage count is as under –
23% (strongly agree), 57% (agree), 16 % (disagree) and 4 % (strongly disagree).
- (v) The parents who found the college campus is safe and free from ragging, discrimination and other type of biases. the result of which according to the actual no. and percentage count is as under –
98% (strongly agree), 2% (agree), 0 % (disagree) and 0 % (strongly disagree).



The outcome:

- The feedback committee found that the outcome of the feedback obtained from the parents is satisfactory and there is no major drawback in the functioning of the institution.
- The committee suggests that the hygiene standards could be improved further and attention should be paid to them.
- The institution's green cover could be improved further through plantation drives.
- The committee found that the teaching and learning methodology engages the pupils in a satisfactory manner according to the collected feedback. The parents are satisfied with the innovative practices applied and use of technical aids in teaching.
- The committee suggests that the parents are not entirely satisfied with the initiatives taken for the campus placement, and this aspect need some immediate intervention from the college authorities who are dealing with it.
- The committee found through the feedback that the college campus is safe for the students and there are no incidents of harassment or abuse occurring within the campus.

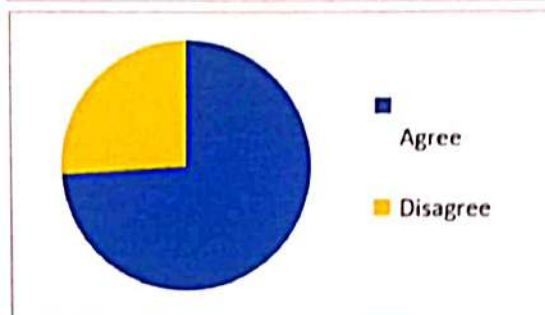

Alumni Feedback: Report (Session: 2022-23)

As per the given instructions the feedback collection committee headed by Ms. Sanju Balot (convener) decided to collect the feedback from the alumni of the institution through offline method. The student nominee and members of the alumni committee were involved in the process. The feedback form were handed over / emailed to the respondents and the filled forms were received by the student nominee. The committee decided to limit the number of respondents to 50, so as to get an easy and convenient analysis of the obtained data.

The method:

The feedback collection committee selected 50 alumni members through random sampling method; each alumni was handed over/emailed a form which was to be filled by him or her to be deposited before the committee within 6 days.

The analysis:

- (i) The alumni members who found the program outcomes are clear, the result of which according to the percentage count is as under –

82% (agree), 18 % (disagree)
- (ii) The alumni members who found, the courses are well organized the result of which according to the percentage count is as under –

74% (agree), 26 % (disagree).
- (iii) The alumni members who rate the course content to real life applications, the result according to the percentage count is as under –

66% (agree), 34% (disagree)
- (iv) The alumni members who found the relevance of curriculum in their job ,the result according to the percentage count is as under –

62% (agree), 38% (disagree)

The result:

- The feedback committee found that the outcome of the feedback obtained from the alumni is satisfactory and there is some discontentment that the program outcomes are not clear, the students are not guided properly with respect to the choices of the programs being offered to them.

The committee suggests that better facility for guidance should be provided to the students about program outcomes.

- The committee found that the members of alumni show some resentment about the courses offered.

The committee suggests that because of the limited choice of courses offered, non-revision of the university syllabus, subject groupings are the major reasons behind this unsatisfactory result, these issues are dealt with in the NEP.

- The committee found through the feedback that the course content does not fully apply to the real life application.

The committee suggests that the courses do not contain practical and skill based learning therefore these courses are not adequately suitable for real life application. This issue is also dealt with in the NEP.

- The committee found through the feedback that the relevance of curriculum in jobs is limited.

The committee suggests that the curriculum is decided at the level of the affiliating university and concerns were raised with respect to the unsuitability of curriculum in job acquisition, This issue is being addressed in the NEP.

The Report of Teacher's Feedback (Session-2022-23)

The teacher's feedback collection committee headed by Sanju Balot and other members of the faculty were assigned the task to collect the feedback from the teachers, The committee performed the assigned task within the given time period and used the following methodology to prepare the report.

The method:

It was decided that the feedback would be collected online through a Google form and the committee will prepare a report to be submitted before the Hon. Director IQAC for further action.

The analysis:

The feedback obtained from the teachers shows that the teachers are satisfied with curriculum aspect , infrastructural support, ICT facilities, supply of consumables and equipment required for teaching and learning, facilities such as laboratories and smart class rooms, reference materials, library, access to online resources, motivation and opportunities provided for academic enhancement, grant of leaves, hygiene and cleanliness inside the campus, efficiency of the administration, ambience and rapport within the institution, grievance redress mechanism adequate representation given in governing body and staff council etc.

The outcome:

The outcome shows ample amount of satisfaction among the members of the faculty about the functioning of the institution. The feedback collection committee arrived at the conclusion that ICT support facilities and laboratories need repair and improvement. The college library and access to online resources need further improvement. The hygiene standards of the institution are not up to the mark. The junior faculty members need better representation in the college committees and other administrative bodies.

Action taken Report: Feedback (session 2022-23)

The college IQAC received the feedback from the stakeholders i.e. students, parents, teachers, and alumni members, which was collected by the committee headed by Ms. Sanju Balot and submitted before the Director IQAC on 29-04-2023. According to the report the following conclusions were drawn which need to be addressed-

- (i) The college campus needs better hygiene standards and cleanliness. The increase in the no. of lavatories equipped with modern amenities in recent years has been a remarkable achievement but the cleanliness of lavatories on a regular basis remains a cause of concern.
- (ii) The campus needs a better green cover and maintenance of gardens.
- (iii) The college's campus placement facilities/initiatives need a facelift.

The college IQAC deliberated on the above mentioned conclusions and found suitable solutions for the same. The issues raised demand immediate attention and subsequent remedies. The college administration has decided that the Administrative Officer will look into the matters of hygiene and cleanliness of the college facilities, he will direct the ministerial employees to ascertain that regular cleaning of the college campus along with all the facilities is done, a complaint register will be kept on an easily accessible place for the stakeholders for registering their complaints.

The college administration would seek help and support from various external agencies, NGOs, etc. to carry out plantation drives in the college campus. A new vendor will be employed for the maintenance of the college gardens.

The college's training and placement cell will be directed to seek help from the local industries, carry out activities of skill development, and try to engage job providers for online and offline placement drives in the college campus.
