FEEDBACK PROCESS

The institution actively gathers feedback on its syllabus and its delivery from students, teachers, and alumni. As an affiliated college of Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya Shekhawati University in Sikar, it follows the course structure and curriculum established by the university. With a team of highly qualified and experienced faculty across its five departments—Hindi, English, ABST, EAFM, and BADM—the college has significant representation on the university's Board of Studies. The college has established both formal and informal mechanisms to collect feedback, with the ultimate goal of making improvements in teaching, learning, assessment, and capacity building.



Feedback from teachers and students is crucial because they are directly engaged in the educational process. Regularly, this feedback is collected through formal channels, both online and offline, using specific questionnaires provided by the institution. Informally, feedback is gathered through individual interactions between faculty members and students. Additionally, teachers share their views on the syllabus with their peers, who, as members of the Board of Studies, present these suggestions at university BOS meetings where necessary revisions are made.

1 STUDENTS' FEEDBACK

Student feedback serves as a crucial element for enhancing the curriculum delivery by the institute's faculty.
