COLLEGE AT A GLANCE

SITUATED in the Aravali hills, the historical city of Alwar has shown continual progress in the field of education. To impart higher education to his subjects, Maharaja Raj Rishi Dev established Raj Rishi College here on 2nd October 1930. It came into existence as an Intermediate College but in the year 1945, it was upgraded to a Graduate College having faculties in Arts and Commerce. Keeping in view the growing strength of students, with every succeeding year, Rajrishi College was bifurcated in 1978-79 into two separate colleges - 'Rajrishi College' with Science and Commerce faculties and 'Government Arts College' with Arts and Law faculties. In the year 1999, Govt. Arts College was renamed after Babu Shobha Ram, one of the luminaries of the Mewat area. He was the first Prime Minister of the Matsya State, the hero of the 'Praj Mandal Movement' and a 'freedom fighter' as well. The Government of Rajasthan thought it appropriate to name one of the leading educational institutions of the state after him.

BSR Government Arts College gradually emerged as one of the leading educational institutes of Rajasthan. The Mewat area has long been known for its communal amity and cultural heritage to which Babu Shobha Ram Govt. Arts College, Alwar is a valuable addition. It is hoped that in the years to come, this institute will take its rightful place among the premier institutes of this country where the youth may receive value-enriched academics along with encouragement to explore life with all its surprises and adventures.

Every year the college enrolls more than 5000 students in its 08 PG Departments and 02 UG Departments. The college has research facilities in 10 different subjects of humanities. The Department of English admits 60 Students for P.G. admissions every year and conducts regular classes with the other academic activities such as internal seminars, debates, group discussions to enhance communicative skills of the students. Presently there are 06 faculty members in the Department of English.
