INTRODUCTION :-

Baba Ganga Das Govt. Girls College, Shahpura (Jaipur) was set up in the year 1997 by the Great saint 1008 Sri Sri Narayan Dasji Maharaj of Triveni Dham in the fond memory of his master's. Master Sri Ganga Das ji Maharaj to give impetus to women education and their development. The foundation of the college was perceived in view of absence of any girl's college in Shahpura (Jaipur) and the nearby rural areas. This college is sixty four kilometers away from Jaipur (Rajasthan) on Delhi Jaipur National Highway No.8. The girls from nearby villages and Shahpura itself take admission in this college because of its regular and uninterrupted classroom teaching associated with curricular and extracurricular activities. Though the staff of college is small there are all three Faculties at UG level. Arts Faculty at B.A. Level gives a choice of eight optional subjects. English Literature as an optional subject was introduced from the session 2003-2004 under the self financing scheme and psychology was introduced from the session 2011-12. This College was declared the best girls institutions in the Jaipur District in the year 2012-13. The keenness for the assessment and accreditation of the college is due to the fact that the purpose of the institution could be served in better spirit. Besides getting good grades, the college will steadily develop with the financial aid from U.G.C. The college is set in rural area where people are quite conservative and orthodox and prefer to send their daughters to a Girls College. The girl students would not be allowed to continue their education in absence of a girl's college. Therefore, with the availability of more resources in the college, the women education and women development will receive greater impetus. The college was set out with four subjects in Arts faculty. Later subjects were added at UG level. In 2010 science and commerce faculty were introduced. Now college running with three PG departments.

Curricular Aspects

B.G.D. Government Girls College Shahpura (Jaipur) upholds the motto of “That is the Education, which is Emancipator” (“सा विद्या या विमुक्तये श्री वि.पु)- 1-19-41) in the realization of its vision of emancipation of the community through value-based holistic higher education. The college offers a plethora of courses - 3 UG and 3 PG programmes affiliated to University of Rajasthan. The curriculum is constantly updated and every new academic programme is strategically planned. The exposure of faculty in recent advances through participation in National/International conferences, seminars, workshops, Refresher/Orientation courses and feedback from students and academic experts give the right impetus and direction for necessary changes in the curriculum. Feedback on curriculum obtained from students, academic peers, parents and stakeholders have facilitated changes of the curriculum, innovative initiatives and ensured continuous growth. Procedure for Written Exam:

- The time table is displayed on the university website and college notice board accordingly.
- Admit cards are generated online.
- The examination process is looked after by center superintendent and examination cell.
- Invigilation duties are allotted to staff members.
- The answer sheets are distributed room wise along with question papers and attendance sheets by the invigilators.
- After examination, the answer sheets are collected by the invigilators and submitted to the Examination Committee for further process.
- After being packed and sealed the answer books are sent to the university.
- The answer books are evaluated fairly in time and results are declared and displayed on the University website and result & mark sheets are sent to the college.

Procedure for Practical Exams is as follows:

- Preparation of time table and student list by the respective departments.
- Inviting external examiners from university Panel.
- Examination, viva-voce is conducted and marks submitted to university online.
- If there is any discrepancy in the relevant subject paper the students can lodge a complaint which is forwarded by the principal. Necessary action is taken by the university and accordingly there is provision for bonus marks.

At the University level, there is provision for re-evaluation of answer sheets. The students can apply for reevaluation and the college forwards the students' complaint to the university. Students have to apply before the last date. The last date for re-evaluation is announced by the University. If there is any change in the marks, it is documented on the new mark-sheet issued to the student.

The regular assignments, labwork, field trips, educational tours, seminars presented by the student etc. are of immense utility to have a personal understanding of the knowledge, comprehension, applicative, analytical and synthetic abilities of the individual students. The various co-curricular activities, like quiz, group-discussions, debates, extempore, essay writing etc., organized under the aegis of various cells and committees of each individual department and the institution, provide an informal evaluating platform for the skills attained by the scholars.

The basic goal of education is to groom the personality in a holistic manner which becomes evident when the student moves out in the community, serving the society and communicating as a responsible citizen of the nation. Education aims at bringing out the best in an individual, with an inclusion of values and ethics and also enhancing their interpersonal and communication skills. Performance of our students during outreach activities and extension programs, viz. NSS, YDC, women cell and also on the sports' ground, mirrors the life skills attained by them during the course of the formal education in the institution. 

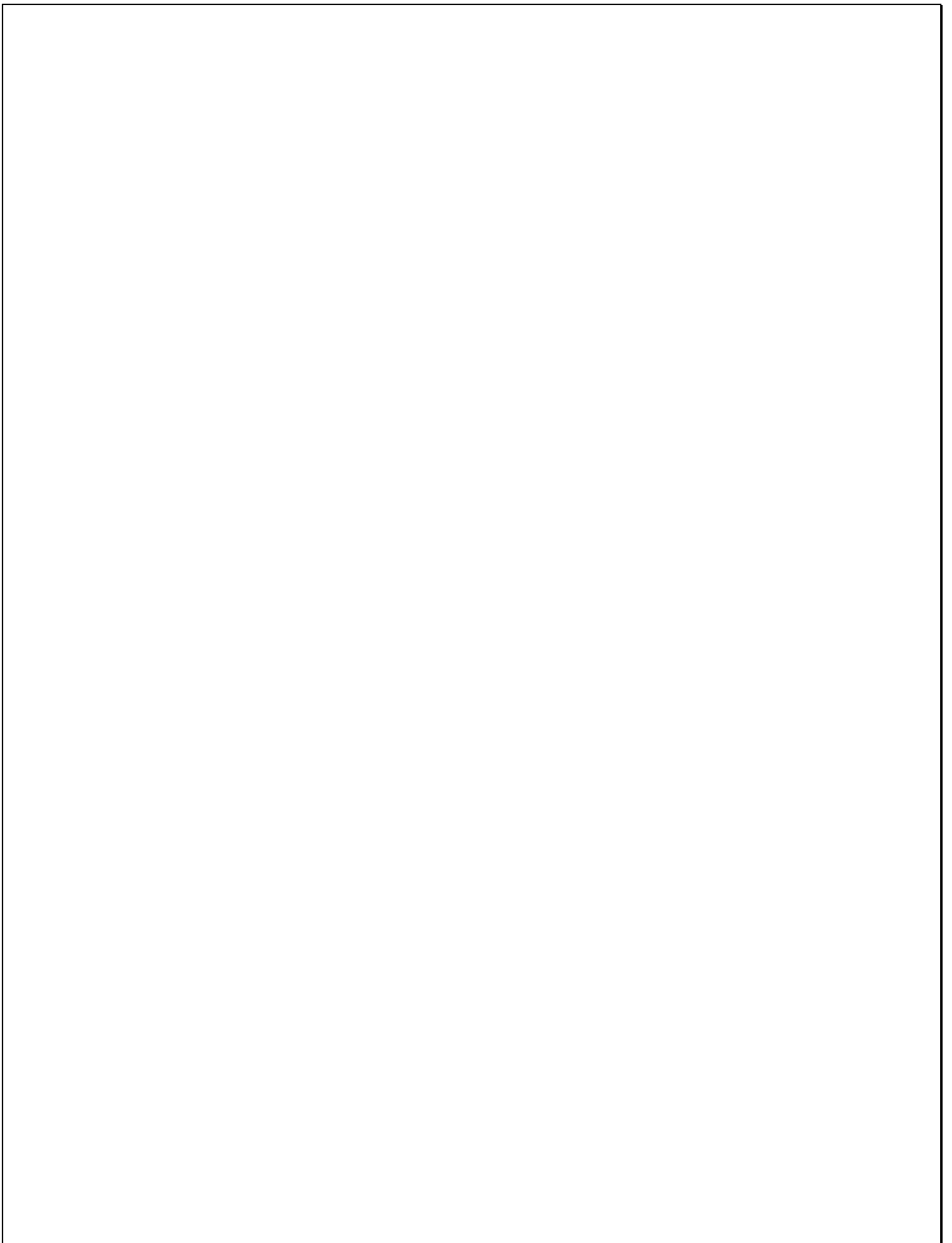
The vision of the College has been to **impart student-centric quality education and inculcate moral values in its pupils.**

Nature of governance: The College comes under the Commissionerate of College Education Rajasthan, Jaipur headed by the Commissioner who manages and administers the government colleges of the state, but at the college level the Principal is the head of the institution. He decentralizes duties and the senior faculty members are given charges of **Establishment section, Accounts section and Academic section** to shoulder various administrative responsibilities. **The Heads/ In charges of various departments act so by virtue of their seniority and are responsible for the functional activities of the Departments.** The performance of every employee, teaching or non-teaching, is appraised by the Principal and reviewed by the competent authority on annual basis covering various aspects of working/ behavior and overall performance.

The Office of the Principal, Staff Council, Mahavidyalaya Vikas Samiti, Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) and various Committees works for the smooth functioning of the institute. The administrative and supervisory role is played by the Office of the Principal. The Staff Council is the highest decision making body of the college by which important decisions of the college are taken. The College Development Committee (Mahavidyalaya Vikas Samiti) takes important decisions about the development of the college and allocating funds for that purpose. The IQAC is responsible for ensuring standards among the teachers and teaching in the college. The other committee's works for their assigned roles.

1. Service Rules: The services of the employees and officers are governed by the Rajasthan Service Rules and the Control, Classification and Appeal rules and the UGC guidelines issued from time to time. The officers of the Rajasthan Government are supposed to follow the General Financial and Accounts Rules of the Rajasthan Government while transacting on behalf of the Government. The spirit of the rules expects only this much that an officer is expected to make Government dealings with the same financial prudence as one may use while doing one's own financial dealing exercise caution.

2. The recruitment of the teaching faculty is done by the Rajasthan Public Service Commissions (RPSC) and the recruited teachers are promoted only after fulfilling the criteria put forward by the University Grants Commission. The eligible teachers are recommended by the IQAC and the promotions are done by the Government accordingly.
