Women Empowerment

Objectives of the practice:

The empowered women are powerful beyond measure and confident beyond description. The institution, being a girls' college, works to provide a plethora of platforms at college to boost the confidence and groom the personalities of students of the rural backdrop.

The significant objectives of the practice follow thus:

- 1. To create a free and fair environment for women's education
- 2. To aware students of human rights and fundamental freedom for equal rights and opportunities
- 3. To address the issues related to women's safety, health, hygiene, employment etc.
- 4. To provide student-centric practices for holistic development

Context

As this is an institution for girls, women constitute the total strength and the majority of students come from nearby villages and hamlets with limited available transportation facilities. Providing education and sports facilities, encouraging them to set and achieve their goals and developing confidence in these rural students is the motto of the institution. The institution identifies the need to enable them to respond to the challenges, confront their traditional roles and change their life for betterment by educating these women. The institution is a post-graduate college with Science faculty (Chemistry) as well as Arts faculty (History, Political Science and Hindi Literature) and offers UG programmes in all three faculties viz. Science, Arts and Commerce and follows the calendar set by the Commissionerate of College Education, Government of Rajasthan and syllabi prescribed by the university to which it is affiliated.

The Practice

The college has entered the 23rd year of its inception. During the entire period, the college has been continuously striving to uplift the status of women through education, training and creating awareness. The mission of our institution is to impart education and overall development of students. In response to the aforesaid agenda, our college, Government Girl's College, Chomu, has organized several productive programmes for developing skills among students as well as faculties. It conducts diverse activities to educate and empower them in different spheres of life be it education, sports, or entrepreneurship. In order to educate women's safety rights, various awareness campaigns and drives have been organized by the faculty with the joint collaboration of the police department. NSS team of the college organized a program for basic awareness of cybercrime to protect the rights and duties of women as a part of women empowerment. The police department of Chomu explained how to use personal information and data on mobile/Laptop/Computers, so that cybercrimes against them could be avoided.

Apart from this, excellent sports infrastructure is provided by the institution. Numerous sports

and games competitions are organised by the institution which helps students to gain confidence and identify their talents and capabilities. Additionally, we encourage students to participate in state and national level competitions and take up sports-related careers. 

Best Practice 2

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSCIOUSNESS

Objectives of the practice

Environmental health is one of the foremost concerns in the world we live in today and there is a great sense of urgency towards combating environmental degradation and encouraging conservational practices. In the rural area where 70% of the Indian population resides and is directly dependent upon natural resources, students should be aware of their responsibilities towards making the environment clean and green. With the objective of contributing towards the efforts of improving the environment around us, Government Girls College, Chomu took the onus upon itself to fulfil its institutional responsibilities by conducting various environmental-based activities.

The Context

The history of Rajasthan is blessed with women's contributions to the environmental conversation and their successful sacrifices. In 1730 AD, a small village located 26 km southeast of Jodhpur in Rajasthan witnessed probably the first and most fierce environment protection movement in the history of the country. In the global scenario, the biggest in environmental history is the Green Belt Movement. The Nobel prize winner Wangari Maathai founded this movement on environment day in June 1977. Government Girls College, Chomu is located on NH-11, 33 km far from Jaipur in Chomu, and is about 5.01 hectares. A large area of the college is not constructed; vacant land is planted with the help of the forest department. The institution, as it is a college for women, has been encouraging plantation and the practice of maintaining the environment through awareness campaigns among students. It aims to bring environment restoration, beautification as well as a good climate for us.

The Practice

The college has run a number of campaigns and rallies to spread awareness and execute practices to save and conserve the environment. The NSS units and Ranger units of the college have played an active role in promoting environmental conservation in society in general. The department of Botany conducts class workshops for the students to explain and make them understand the economic and medicinal value of plants through displays of plants and detailed charts. The use of plastic bags is avoided on campus and the authority has declared the entire campus as a "No Plastic Zone" and a 'No Tobacco Zone.` NSS units organized 'Harit Rajasthan' Program on 24 July 2017 and plantation drive from 24th July 29th July 2017. An awareness rally was conducted on 24th September 2019 to spread awareness about environment consciousness as a part of the fortnight program of 150th anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi (24-09-2019 to 08-

10-2019). A cleaning drive has also been carried out by NSS volunteers and Ranger units from time to time. "Swacchta Pakhwada" has been organised from 02 October to 17 October 2020 by the college during which all students and staff members have contributed to cleaning the campus. The tree plantation drive is initiated in the campus and nearby areas by NSS volunteers, Rangers and through the Aanandam programme.

A field trip was undertaken by the students of the Department of Science to *Smriti Van*. The field trip was conducted with the intention to give students a field based study on the importance of the eco-tourism in providing a means of livelihood to the people.

Students have also contributed to protecting and conserving the environment in many ways:

- Students have been motivated to keep the environment of their houses healthy by growing plants such as medicinal, ornamental and vegetable plants which can be easily grown. This practice inculcated the hobby of gardening among them.
- Students and staff are motivated to use jute bags or cotton bags.
- The students and staff have planted several tree saplings during various tree plantation programmes organized by the institution through the NSS units and all these trees are taken care of and maintained by the volunteers.
- Students have been inspired to pursue habits and practices like not spoiling and harming plants/trees during their visits to the garden and public areas and to love and respect nature.

Evidence of success

Government Girls College, Chomu is committed to spreading environmental consciousness and environment protection through the core values and its vision. The institution makes all possible efforts to make the premises green and eco-friendly. To spread awareness and make the campus green, the institution has organised many activities like regular plantation drives, poster competitions, social campaigns, field visits, workshops and seminars.





The institution has an environment-friendly campus with a well-maintained garden and a number of trees of environmental and medicinal importance. The institution is committed to raising the

level of environmental consciousness among students and inspiring them to conserve and protect the environment through its curriculum and regular extension activities.

A new garden has been developed and maintained in front of the college building. The trees and plants which can be grown with minimum water resources have been planted in the garden and on the campus. Trees, shrubs, climbers, herbs and seasonal flowers are planted in the botanical garden which assists the students in their studies. Medicinal plants like Aloe Vera, Azadirachta Indica Tyiophora and Osmium sanctum etc., are also maintained on the campus. Non-toxic chemicals are included in the institution's practical curriculum. Most of the waste generated is water-soluble and ultimately disposed of through a normal sewage system, diluted largely so bio magnifications are negligent. Dust bins are placed all over the campus to inculcate the habit of cleanliness among students. LED lights are being used on campus to save electricity. The solar energy plant is to be installed soon on the campus.

NSS volunteers of the college play a major role in awareness of plantation and cleaning the college environment. They run campaigns for teaching villagers how to keep houses and surrounding areas clean and its benefits to avoid all harmful effects. The Department of Botany organized a class workshop for the B.Sc. students explaining and making them understand the economic and medicinal value of plants through displays of plants and detailed charts. The college garden comprises grassy lawns herbs, shrubs trees and climbers. Angiosperms with few Gymnosperms growing on the college campus like Neem Cassia, Khejri, China rose, Amla, Bael, etc. are displayed with their respective Botanical Name Plates. Also, various ornamental, medicinal and seasonal flowering plants are grown every year for the students' studies purposes.
