Introduction

In its infancy, the Government Girls College, Chomu was commenced in Government Maheshwari Secondary School, Chomu as there was no building available earmarked for the college. This college was inaugurated on 7th July 1999 at the hands of Shri Bhagwan Sahai Saini, Hon'ble MLA. The Jaipur Development Authority allotted 5.01 hectares of land to the college and possession of which was obtained by the college authorities on 4th September 2002. The foundation stone of the present building of the college was laid on 3rd February 2006 by Hon'ble Shri Ghanshyam Tiwari, the then-Education Minister of Rajasthan and also the new building was inaugurated by him on 21st February 2007. The objectives of the college are to bring out and groom the hidden talents among the students by facilitating them with the latest means of higher education in their chosen fields of study. Currently, at the undergraduate level, the college runs classes in all three faculties i.e. Arts, Commerce and Science. The college has well-equipped laboratory facilities for both the Arts as well Science faculties. The college also runs postgraduate classes in History, Hindi and Political Science for the Faculty of Arts, and also in Chemistry for the Faculty of Science.
